Who Can Be A Member?

ASSOCIATE MEMBERSHIP:

Associate Membership in Retired Teachers of Ontario includes, among other categories, the following:

- NEW:**
- *a retired non-educator employee of an Ontario School Board or educational organization. This category includes Office Administrators, Caretaking and Maintenance Staff, Speech and Language Pathologists, Educational Assistants and Supervisory Staff.
 - *a retired educator who is receiving a pension from a University or College in Canada.
 - *a retired teacher who opted for the commuted value of his/her contributions to the Ontario Teachers' Pension Plan.
 - *a retired teacher receiving a pension from a non-designated Ontario private school.

FULL MEMBERSHIP:

Full Membership in Retired Teachers of Ontario includes the following categories:

- *a retired teacher who is receiving a pension from the Ontario Teachers' Pension Plan.
- NEW** *a retired teacher with a minimum of 15 years of credited service who opted for a commuted value transfer from the Ontario Teachers' Pension Plan following the Ontario Teachers' Pension Plan rules in place at the time of commutation.
